Dkt. No. 4. Civil Local 20 Rule 7-3(a) requires parties to file and serve an opposition within fourteen days after a 21 motion is filed. In the alternative, a party who does not oppose the motion must file a 22 statement of nonopposition with the Court within fourteen days. Civ. L.R. 7-3(b). Where, 23 as in this case, the motion was not served through the Court's Electronic Case Filing (ECF) 24 system, see Dkt. No. 4-3, these deadlines are extended by 3 days. Civ. L.R. 7-3(a). 25 Accordingly, Buck's response to defendants' motion was due by September 30, 2013. 26 Buck has not filed a response. "Failure to follow a district court's local rules is a proper 27 ground for dismissal." Ghazali v. Moran, 46 F.3d 52, 53 (9th Cir. 1995). Accordingly, 28 Case No. 13-cv-04084 NC ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

1	Buck has until October 11, 2013, to oppose defendants' motion to dismiss (or file a
2	statement of nonopposition) and to show cause why this action should not be dismissed.
3	Buck's failure to respond will result in dismissal of this case with prejudice.
4	Buck must also consent or decline the jurisdiction of a magistrate judge by October
5	11, 2013. See attached consent/declination forms.
