21	While this order is sympathetic to plaintiff's current circumstances, plaintiff's request for
22	judicial notice cannot be granted. <i>First</i> , plaintiff requests that "the mysterious check" allegedly
23	sent to him on October 28, 2013, be judicially noticed. The law on judicial notice, however,
25	only allows courts to judicially notice a fact that "is generally known within the trial court's
26	territorial jurisdiction; or (2) can be accurately and readily determined from sources whose
27	accuracy cannot reasonably be questioned." FRE 201. The accuracy of the mysterious check is
28	at best questionable given that plaintiff does not know who sent the check. Moreover, the check
	is not relevant to plaintiff's pending social security appeal. <i>Second</i> , plaintiff states that he left "bis residence to comply with the court order" (Pr. et 2). Thus, plaintiff requests "the date of the
