29, 2015, the Court and the parties discussed the timeline pled in the Complaint regarding the loan modification submission, trial period plan offer and denial of a permanent modification. The Court granted Verhoek leave to amend the complaint to address some of the issues raised at the hearing. US Bank has subsequently sent
