related documents. As Plaintiffs have been unable to serve Defendant's agent for service of process, Plaintiffs inquired as to whether Defendant's counsel would accept service of the Summons, Complaint, and related documents. Defendant's counsel advised that, upon approval from Defendant, he would accept service. Upon receipt of the Complaint and related documents, the parties agreed to discuss this matter further in an effort to reach an informal resolution. If Defendant's counsel is unable to accept service of the Summons, Complaint, and related documents, Plaintiffs will resume attempts to personally serve Defendant and continue efforts to resolve this matter informally.

- Accordingly, Plaintiffs respectfully request that the Case Management Conference, currently scheduled for November 3, 2015, be continued for approximately 60 - 90 days to allow sufficient time for completion of service of process on Defendant and for the parties to attempt to reach an informal resolution of this matter.
- 5. There are no issues that need to be addressed by the parties at the currently scheduled Case Management Conference. In the interest of conserving costs as well as the Court's time and resources, Plaintiffs respectfully request that the Court continue the currently scheduled Case Management Conference.
