ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Docket No. 6

Upon initial review pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915A, the Court determined that Plaintiff's initial pleading failed to state a claim upon which relief may be granted and granted Plaintiff leave to file an amended complaint. *See* Docket No. 5. The Court cautioned Plaintiff that failure to file an amended complaint by the deadline would result in the dismissal of this action. *See id.* at 8. Plaintiff did not file an amended complaint, and the deadline by which to do so has long passed.

Although Plaintiff failed to file an amended complaint, she did file document entitled "writ of mandamus to require records for court, for notice & instructions." Docket No. 6. The document requests the California Secretary of State to certify a record (identified only by a record number) and file it in 19 federal court cases, several state agencies and courts, and about a dozen federal agencies and courts. The document does not provide the information the Court directed Plaintiff to provide in an amended complaint and fails to state a claim upon which relief may be granted.
