ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE Re: Dkt. No. 24

12 Plaintiff Terrance Turner, proceeding without an attorney, filed this civil action alleging a 13 multi-billion dollar fraud involving the government and Defendant Splunk Inc. Splunk has moved to dismiss Mr. Tuner's complaint for failure to state a claim and for lack of subject matter 14 15 jurisdiction. (Dkt. No. 24.) Although Mr. Turner's response to the motion was due February 16, 2021, Mr. Turner has not filed a response or otherwise communicated with the Court. 16 Accordingly, Mr. Turner is ORDERED TO SHOW CAUSE as to why this action should not be 17 18 dismissed for failure to prosecute. See Fed. R. Civ. Pro. 41(b). Mr. Turner shall respond to this 19 Order to Show Cause in writing by March 23, 2021 and simultaneously file his response to Splunk's motion to dismiss. The March 25, 2021 hearing on Splunk's motion to dismiss is 20 VACATED. 21

Mr. Turner is warned that his failure to respond to this Order may lead to dismissal with prejudice, that is, the termination of his case, for his failure to prosecute. Mr. Turner is reminded that he can obtain free legal assistance by contacting the Legal Help Desk at 415.782.8982.
