11 On May 10, 2012, Defendants filed an amended administrative
12 motion seeking to file under seal unredacted versions of their
13 appendix of evidentiary objections, the declarations of M. Mayes,
14 D. Zanchi, A. Favila, S. Aref, C. Ramirez, J. Cutillo, V. Cullen,
15 J. Cazavos, S. Chapman, S. Cheney, G. Jaime, T. Miguel, J. Blim,
16 R. Sweeny, D. Fischer, G. Stratton, S. Smith, M. Overstreet, C.
17 Arthur, J. Curzon, R. Binkele, and R. Nipper, and the exhibits
18 attached to these declarations. Defendants offer these documents
19 in support of their opposition to Plaintiffs' request for an order
20 to show cause and motion to hold Defendants in contempt. The
21 parties also filed an amended stipulation agreeing that the
22 unredacted documents should be filed under seal. The parties
23 represent that these documents contain personal information of
24 inmates, including their names and CDCR numbers. The parties
25 further stipulate that redacted versions of these documents, in
26 which any information identifying an inmate is omitted, will be
27 filed in the public record.

28 Because the public interest favors filing all court documents
in the public record, any party seeking to file a document under

1 seal must demonstrate good cause to do so. Pintos v. Pac.
2 Creditors Ass'n, 605 F.3d 665, 678 (9th Cir. 2010). This cannot
3 be established simply by showing that the document is subject to a
4 protective order or by stating in general terms that the material
5 is considered to be confidential, but rather must be supported by
6 a sworn declaration demonstrating with particularity the need to
7 file each document under seal. See Civil Local Rule 79-5(a).

8 The parties have provided reasons supporting the sealing of
9 the unredacted documents. Accordingly, Defendants' motion for
10 leave to file under seal and the parties' stipulation authorizing
11 sealing are GRANTED (Docket Nos. 2053 and 2055). Within four days
12 of the date of this Order, Defendants shall electronically file
13 under seal unredacted versions of their appendix of evidentiary
14 objections, the declarations of M. Mayes, D. Zanchi, A. Favila, S.
15 Aref, C. Ramirez, J. Cutillo, V. Cullen, J. Cazavos, S. Chapman,
16 S. Cheney, G. Jaime, T. Miguel, J. Blim, R. Sweeny, D. Fischer, G.
17 Stratton, S. Smith, M. Overstreet, C. Arthur, J. Curzon, R.
18 Binkele, and R. Nipper, and the exhibits attached to these
19 declarations, and shall file redacted versions of these documents
20 in the public record.
