A judgment for taxable costs in the amount of \$622,036.38 was entered in the above captioned case on December 5, 2012 in the United States District Court for the Northern District of California against Appellant, Kalitta Air, L.L.C., and in favor of Central Texas Airborne Systems, Inc.

Kalitta Air, L.L.C. has filed a timely notice of appeal of this judgment to the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit and desires to suspend enforcement of the judgment pending determination of the appeal.

Pursuant to the Order of the United States District Court for the Northern District of California dated December 5, 2012, collection of the costs pending determination of the appeal would be stayed on condition that Kalitta Air, L.L.C. post a supersedeas bond in the amount of fifty percent of the taxable costs or \$311,018.19

Promise to Pay

Travelers Casualty and Surety Company of America, which has an office and usual place of business at One Tower Square, Hartford, CT 06183, undertakes and promises to immediately pay to Central Texas Airborne Systems, Inc. all damages, costs, and interest that may be awarded to it following the appeal of this matter up to the sum of \$311,018.19 if:


- a. The judgment so appealed is affirmed; or
- b. The appeal is dismissed; or
- c. Kalitta Air, L.L.C. fails to pay within seven days all sums awarded against it in or following the appeal in this action, including the full \$622,036.38 as ordered by the court along with any additional costs or interest that the court of appeals may award.

Until Kalitta Air, L.L.C. fulfills all of its obligations on appeal, including payment of the full \$622,036.38 as ordered by the court along with any additional costs that the court of appeals may award, this obligation will remain in full force and effect.

In no event shall the maximum aggregate liability of the Surety under this Bond exceed Three Hundred Eleven Thousand Eighteen Dollars and 19/100 - - - - - Dollars (\$311,018.19)
