11	and/or their affiliates' officers, directors and employees in Europe (the "potential European		
12	litigation"). Likewise, to the extent provided herein, counsel for Defendants and/or for their		
13	affiliates may use Discovery Materials produced in this action that are designated as		
14	"Confidential Information" or "Highly Confidential Information – Attorneys Eyes Only" for		
15	purposes of investigating and preparing defense strategies to the potential European litigation.		
16	2. The following individuals shall have access to "Confidential Information"		
17	or "Highly Confidential Information – Attorneys Eyes Only" Discovery Materials for purposes		
18	of investigating and preparing the potential European litigation, and defense strategies thereto,		
19	described in paragraph 1 above:		
20	(a) The parties' in-house and outside counsel who are authorized to		
21	receive Confidential or Highly Confidential Discovery Materials under the Protective Order as in		
22	existed prior to this modification;		
23	(b) Up to a total of two (2) additional in-house counsel for Plaintiffs		
24	and/or Plaintiffs' affiliates, and up to a total of two (2) additional in-house counsel for		
25	Defendants and/or Defendants' affiliates. Each party will identify said in-house counsel to the		
26	other by email prior to the additional in-house counsel's receipt of Confidential or Highly		
27	Confidential Discovery Materials. Either party may replace either or both of these additional in-

15	prosecute and/or defend the litigation contemplated in paragraph 1 above, and this order is
