14 Defendant D. Williams moves for leave to file a successive
15 motion for summary judgment. Plaintiff Isaiah Williams opposes
16 the motion.


17 Because Defendant seeks to raise essentially the same
18 arguments that she raised in her previous summary judgment motion,
19 her request for leave to file a second summary judgment motion is
20 denied. Defendant has not identified any newly discovered
21 evidence or recent case law that would disturb the Court's prior
22 summary judgment ruling. See Docket No. 82. While she proposes
23 to offer an "expanded record" with her second summary judgment
24 motion, Def.'s Mot. 3, this record -- which consists mostly of
25 Defendant's own deposition testimony -- remains in conflict with
26 much of Plaintiff's evidence. As such, allowing Defendant to file
27 another summary judgment motion would not resolve any disputes of
28 material fact or meaningfully advance this litigation.
