11	Before the court is the stipulation and request of the parties to modify the case
12	management and pretrial order. As the parties were previously advised, the court requires
13	120 days between hearing dispositive motions and trial. The court's practice is based in
14	part upon its assumption that the parties prefer to have rulings on dispositive motions
15	before commencing pretrial preparation. The time allotted by the court is particularly critical
16	in a case such as this that involves multiple defendants and where there is as yet no
17	agreement that all defendants will join in one dispositive motion.
18	Accordingly, the court approves the proposed extension of the expert deadline and
19	the dispositive hearing deadline, but also continues the trial date. the new schedule is as
20	follows:
21	Expert disclosures on or before May 20, 2009
22	Last day for dispositive motions July 29, 2009 at 9:00 am
23	Pretrial conference October 29, 2009 at 2:30 pm
24	Trial on November 16, 2009 at 8:30 am
25	No further continuances will be permitted.
