2 Desert Gold Mining Co., 433 F.2d 713, 715 (9th Cir. 1970)).

3 Plaintiff presents no grounds that warrant reconsideration. As explained in the Court's Order 4 denying appointment of counsel, there is no constitutional right to counsel in a civil case unless an 5 indigent litigant may lose his physical liberty if he loses the litigation. See Lassiter v. Dep't of 6 Social Services, 452 U.S. 18, 25 (1981); Rand v. Rowland, 113 F.3d 1520, 1525 (9th Cir. 1997) (no 7 constitutional right to counsel in § 1983 action), withdrawn in part on other grounds on reh'g en 8 banc, 154 F.3d 952 (9th Cir. 1998) (en banc). The court may ask counsel to represent an indigent litigant under 28 U.S.C. § 1915 only in "exceptional circumstances," the determination of which 9 10 requires an evaluation of both (1) the likelihood of success on the merits, and (2) the ability of the plaintiff to articulate his claims pro se in light of the complexity of the legal issues involved. See id. 11 12 at 1525; Terrell v. Brewer, 935 F.2d 1015, 1017 (9th Cir. 1991); Wilborn v. Escalderon, 789 F.2d 1328, 1331 (9th Cir. 1986). Both of these factors must be viewed together before reaching a 13 14 decision on a request for counsel under § 1915. See id. At present, the Court is unable to assess at 15 this time whether exceptional circumstances exist which would warrant seeking volunteer counsel to 16 accept a pro bono appointment. The proceedings are at an early stage and it is premature for the Court to determine Plaintiff's likelihood of success on the merits. Moreover, Plaintiff has been able 17 18 to articulate his claims adequately pro se in light of the complexity of the issues involved. See 19 Agyeman v. Corrections Corp. of America, 390 F.3d 1101, 1103 (9th Cir. 2004). Accordingly, 20 Petitioner's motion for reconsideration is DENIED because appointment of counsel is not necessary 21 at this time. 22 This Order terminates Docket no. 13. 23 IT IS SO ORDERED.
