 10 Pending before the Court is Defendants' motion to dismiss. Upon review of the record in
 11 this action, the Court notes that not all parties have filed written consents to Magistrate Judge James'
 12 jurisdiction. This civil case was randomly assigned to Magistrate Judge James for all purposes
 13 including trial. In accordance with 28 U.S.C. § 636(c), the magistrate judges of this district court are
 14 designated to conduct any and all proceedings in a civil case, including trial and entry of final
 15 judgment, upon the consent of the parties. An appeal from a judgment entered by Magistrate Judge
 16 James may be taken directly to the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit in the same
 17 manner as an appeal from any other judgment of a district court.

18 You have the right to have your case assigned to a United States District Judge for trial and
 19 disposition. Accordingly, all parties that have not already done so shall inform the Court whether
 20 they consent to Magistrate Judge James' jurisdiction or request reassignment to a United States
 21 District Judge for trial. A copy of both the consent and declination forms may be obtained from the
 22 Northern District of California's website at <http://www.cand.uscourts.gov/>. From the homepage,
 23 click on the "Forms" tab on the left margin, then choose "Civil." The parties shall inform the Court
 24 of their decision by November 9, 2010.
