9 On December 13, 2010, Petitioner, a state prisoner, filed a 10 document with the Court entitled, "Motion for Continuance of Time 11 for Filing My Writ of Habeas Corpus With the Federal Court System," 12 which was opened as a habeas corpus action. In his motion, 13 Petitioner requests "additional time for filing [his] writ of 14 habeas corpus in the federal court, stemming from the denial of 15 [his] state supreme court writ on 11/17/10, S182357." (Pet'r Mot. 16 at 1.) He further states: "I am requesting an additional 30 days 17 after my release from administrative segregation and being released 18 to general population, where I can successfully obtain law library 19 access and acquire the legal documents that are in my boxed-up 20 property." (Id.)

21 On the same day the action was filed the Clerk of the Court 22 sent a notice to Petitioner informing him that his action could not 23 go forward until he filed with the Court a habeas corpus petition 24 form, completed in full, within thirty days or his action would be 25 dismissed. He was also sent another notice directing him to either 26 pay the filing fee or file a completed prisoner's in forma pauperis 27 (IFP) application. The Clerk sent Petitioner a blank IFP 28 application and told him that he must pay the fee or return the

United States District Court For the Northern District of California 1 completed application within thirty days or his action would be 2 dismissed.

On January 24, 2011, the Clerk sent Petitioner a second notice
directing him to file his IFP application and a habeas corpus
petition form within thirty days or his action would be dismissed.

6 On January 31, 2011, Petitioner sent a letter to the Court 7 requesting another extension of time to file his petition because 8 he was being "illegally barred from having access to [his] legal 9 property, [from] all law library access, and the administration 10 won't even sign my pauperis form." (Jan. 31, 2011 Letter at 1.)

On February 11, 2011, the Clerk sent Petitioner a third notice, granting him another thirty-day extension of time in which to file the requisite documents or his action would be dismissed. More than thirty days have passed since the date of the Clerk's third notice, and Petitioner has not filed a petition or

Accordingly, this action is DISMISSED without prejudice for failure to prosecute, pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 41(b). Because the Court has already provided Petitioner with three extensions of time to file his petition and IFP application, his "Motion for Continuance of Time for Filing My Writ of Habeas Corpus With the Federal Court System" (docket no. 1) is DENIED as moot.

The Clerk shall enter judgment in accordance with this Order,terminate all pending motions and close the file.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
