Court Processes:

- Non-binding Arbitration (ADR L.R. 4)

- Mediation (ADR L.R. 6)

- Private ADR (please identify process and provider) The parties have agreed to private mediation with Cathy Yanni as mediator.

The parties agree to hold the ADR session by:

- the presumptive deadline (The deadline is 90 days from the date of the order referring the case to an ADR process unless otherwise ordered.)
- other requested deadline to be determined at the Case Management Conference on January 11, 2012.
