11 Plaintiff Colony Insurance Company has filed a motion for
12 summary judgment on its claims against Defendants Douglas Fladseth
13 and the Law Offices of Douglas C. Fladseth, and has noticed its
14 motion for hearing on October 25, 2012. Docket No. 42. The Court
15 previously set March 7, 2013 as the deadline to hear all case-
16 dispositive motions and set a schedule for the filing of such
17 motions. Docket No. 41.

18 The Court prefers to hear all case-dispositive motions at one
19 time, absent a good reason to do otherwise. Plaintiff's motion
20 may be heard on the date noticed as long as Defendants are
21 prepared to oppose it and neither party intends to file another
22 case-dispositive motion to be heard at a later date. The parties
23 shall meet and confer about the schedule and file an appropriate
24 motion under L.R. 7-11 if they are unable to agree.

25 If Defendants wish to file a cross-motion for summary
26 judgment, they shall do so according to the schedule set forth in
27 the case management order and shall include the cross-motion in
28 their opposition to Plaintiff's motion. If Defendants file such a

1 cross-motion with their opposition, Plaintiff shall include its
2 opposition to Defendants' cross-motion in its reply in support of
3 its motion, which shall be filed one week later and Defendants
4 shall file a reply in support of their cross-motion one week
5 later.

6 IT IS SO ORDERED.
