This option is being made available because the magistrate judges in this 14 district have smaller civil dockets and no felony criminal cases and may be able to adjudicate this 15 case more expeditiously than the undersigned district judge. 16 Accordingly, the parties are hereby **DIRECTED** to advise the court, no later than **November** 17 **26, 2012**, whether they consent to have a magistrate judge conduct all further proceedings in the

instant action. Normally the parties would be directed to so inform the court in their Joint Case
Management Statement filed in connection with the initial case management conference. However,
because this case involves a review of an administrative record, a case management conference has
not been scheduled. The parties are advised that they may jointly request assignment to a specific
