DISCOVERY ORDER
[Re: ECF No. 338]

The plaintiffs in this case challenge payday loans that they allege were illegal primarily because the lenders were unlicensed.¹ The latest discovery dispute is the letter brief at ECF No. 338.² The court finds that it can determine two issues without oral argument under Civil Local Rule 7-1(b) and sets the third for a hearing on July 21, 2016, at 9:30 a.m. Counsel may appear by telephone. The court rules as follows.

1. Interrogatory 10: There is no dispute here. Selling Source’s response is sufficient.
2. Interrogatory 11: The interrogatory is not vague. Selling Source must respond with its websites used during the class period that would have been used to refer California residents to

lenders. It appears it has done this sufficiently by disclosing the list of California residents with associated URL sites.

3. Interrogatory 12: The court will hold a hearing on July 21.
