16	The certificate of service Plaintiff filed in connection with her motion for summary

20	(Certificates of Service, Dkt. Nos. 7, 10.) The certificate of service filed in connection with the

23	This does not comply with Fed. R. Civ. P 4(i). That rule prescribes the manner in which	
24	the United States is to be served, which requires, among other things, sending a copy of the	
25	summons and complaint by registered or certified mail to the Attorney General of the United	
26	States in Washington, D.C. See id.	
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United States District Court Northern District of California Accordingly, Plaintiff shall promptly file a certificate of service showing that Defendant has been served in a manner consistent with Fed. R. Civ. P. 4(i). The hearing on Plaintiff's motion for summary judgment is VACATED. Plaintiff shall re-notice her motion, in accordance with Civil Local Rule 7-2, once Defendant has been properly served, made an appearance, and has consented to the undersigned's jurisdiction pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 636(c).
