The joint letter 17 18 must be electronically filed under the Civil Events category of "Motions and Related Filings >Motions-- General > Discovery Letter Brief." The Magistrate Judge to whom the matter is 19 20 assigned will advise the parties of how that Judge intends to proceed. The Magistrate Judge may issue a ruling, order more formal briefing, or set a telephone conference or a hearing. After a 21 22 Magistrate Judge has been assigned, all further discovery matters shall be filed pursuant to that 23 Judge's procedures.
