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Criminal Law and Motion calendar is conducted on Tuesdays at 2:00 p.m. Case Management Conferences and Pretrial Conferences are conducted on **Tuesdays** at 2:30 p.m. **Civil Motion** calendar is conducted on **Tuesdays** at 2:30 p.m. Order of call is determined by the Court. Parties need not reserve a hearing date for civil motions; however, parties must check the legal newspapers or the Court's website at www.cand.uscourts.gov for unavailable dates.

Discovery disputes will be referred to a Magistrate Judge. After the parties have met and conferred, the parties shall prepare a joint letter of not more than 8 pages explaining the dispute. Up to 12 pages of attachments may be added. The joint letter must electronically filed under the Civil Events category be of > Discovery "Motions and Related Filings >Motions-- General Letter Brief." The Magistrate Judge to whom the matter is assigned will advise the parties of how that Judge intends to proceed. The Magistrate Judge may issue a ruling, order more formal briefing, or set a telephone conference or a hearing. After a Magistrate Judge has been assigned, all further discovery matters shall be filed pursuant to that Judge's procedures.

Motions for Summary Judgment: Absent permission from the Court, all case-dispositive motions in a case will be briefed and heard 14 together, on the case-dispositive motion hearing cut-off date, or on an earlier available date agreed to by the parties.
