ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

12 On April 25, 2017, plaintiff Vikki Ordonez filed an amended complaint against
13 Equifax, Inc. ("Equifax") and JPMorgan Chase Bank, N.A. ("Chase"). Dkt. 17. Ordonez
14 subsequently filed a notice of settlement with Chase, who was voluntarily dismissed as a
15 defendant. Dkt. 23, 29. However, Equifax remains as a defendant in this case.

16 The parties stipulated that Equifax need not file a response to the amended
17 complaint until June 15, 2017. Dkt. 26. However, more than a month later, Equifax still
18 has not filed an answer, a motion to dismiss, or another stipulation to extend the time to
19 respond. Plaintiff has not filed a motion for an entry of default.

20 In light of the foregoing, the court hereby ORDERS Equifax to SHOW CAUSE **by**
21 **August 7, 2017** why a default should not be entered due to its failure to timely respond to
22 the complaint.

23 **IT IS SO ORDERED.**
