SUBJECT: Adjustments to Funding Sources for Military Construction Projects Undertaken Pursuant to Section 2808 of Title 10, U.S. Code

Background

- On February 15, 2019, the President declared a national emergency in accordance with the National Emergencies Act and determined that the crisis at the southern border is a national emergency that requires the use of the armed forces. The President decided to continue this declaration of national emergency on February 13, 2020.
- This declaration made available 10 U.S.C. § 2808, which authorizes the Secretary of
 Defense, without regard to any other provision of law, to undertake military construction
 (MILCON) projects not otherwise authorized by law that are necessary to support the use of
 the armed forces in connection with the national emergency.
- On September 3, 2019, you determined that 11 border barrier projects are MILCON projects necessary to support use of the armed forces in connection with the national emergency requiring use of the armed forces, and decided to undertake those projects as authorized by Section 2808.
- Also on September 3, 2019, you directed that 127 MILCON projects, totaling \$3.6 billion, be deferred to fund the MILCON projects to be undertaken pursuant to Section 2808.
 Consistent with your direction:
 - Funding for deferred MILCON projects outside the United States has been provided to the Secretary of the Army for Section 2808 project execution (\$1.8 billion).
 - Funding for deferred MILCON projects in the United States (including U.S. territories) is currently on withhold from the Components (\$1.8 billion) and has not been provided to the Secretary of the Army, as the funds are not currently needed for obligation.

Funding Sources

- Of the \$1.8B of deferred MILCON projects in the United States (including U.S. territories), 22 projects in 17 States are scheduled for award in calendar year 2020 (based on January 2020 data). Releasing funding for these projects now will permit them to be undertaken in a timely manner, but will also require identification of additional projects to defer to ensure sufficient funds are available to execute the approved 2808 projects.
 - One Section 2808 deferred project (Replace Fuel Facilities at Klamath Falls, Oregon -\$2.5 million), with an award date of October 2020, is not recommended for release

because its initial cancellation was withdrawn to undertake additional analysis that is ongoing.

- In conjunction with the Components, Comptroller staff reviewed MILCON projects authorized in fiscal year (FY) 2020 and based on January 2020 data identified 16 projects outside the United States that could be deferred to ensure sufficient funds are available for Section 2808 projects after releasing funding to execute some of the currently deferred projects. In conducting this review, Comptroller staff considered only projects outside the United States that are scheduled for award in FY 2021 or later, and did not consider any family housing, barracks, dormitory, or disaster response projects for deferral.
- In addition to the funds associated with these projects, Comptroller staff identified amounts
 associated with MILCON projects that have been cancelled this FY for reasons not
 associated with the national emergency at the southern border, as well as excess MILCON
 planning and design funds.
 - With respect to the cancelled projects, the Department would not make any funds associated with such projects available until 14 days have elapsed after the date on which the notice to Congress required by Section 2853 of title 10, United States Code, was submitted.
 - The Comptroller would manage the release of funds for currently deferred projects in a manner to ensure that at all times sufficient amounts are available to fund the previously-approved Section 2808 MILCON projects.
- In total, we have identified \$545.526 million in unobligated MILCON funds that could be used in lieu of funding associated with 22 currently deferred projects.
- The memorandum at TAB A provides further direction regarding projects to be deferred to fund Section 2808 border barrier MILCON projects. Specifically, this memorandum:
 - Approves removing 22 previously deferred projects inside the 50 United States, totaling \$545.526 million, that are scheduled for award in calendar year 2020 from the deferred project list, thereby enabling the projects to be executed as soon as practicable; and
 - Directs that \$545.526 million from (1) two projects that have been cancelled for reasons not associated with border barrier MILCON; (2) the deferral of 16 projects outside the United States that are scheduled to award in FY 2021 or later; and (3) amounts excess to need for planning and design, be used as replacement sources to ensure adequate funding remains available for the current Section 2808 MILCON effort.

MEMORANDUM FOR ACTING UNDER SECRETARY OF DEFENSE (COMPTROLLER)/CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER

SUBJECT: Adjustments to Funding Sources for Military Construction Projects Undertaken Pursuant to Title 10, U.S. Code, Section 2808

On February 15, 2019, in accordance with the National Emergencies Act, the President declared that a national emergency exists at the southern border requiring the use of the Armed Forces. This declaration was continued on February 13, 2020. This declaration made available, among other statutes, 10 U.S.C. § 2808, which authorizes the Secretary of Defense, without regard to any other provision of law, to undertake military construction projects not otherwise authorized by law that are necessary to support the use of the Armed Forces in connection with the national emergency.

Based on analysis and advice from the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and input from the Commander, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the Department of Homeland Security, and the Department of the Interior and pursuant to the authority granted to me in section 2808, I previously determined that 11 military construction projects along the international border with Mexico are necessary to support the use of the Armed Forces in connection with the national emergency.

To undertake these section 2808 border barrier military construction projects, I approved the use of \$3.6 billion of unobligated military construction funds. I directed that you make \$1.8 billion in funding from projects that are outside the United State immediately available to the Secretary of the Army for section 2808 execution and further directed you to make the remaining \$1.8 billion available from projects located in the United States to the Secretary of the Army once needed for obligation. To enable the execution of certain projects scheduled for award in calendar year 2020, I direct you to release funding associated with 22 currently deferred projects within the United States totaling \$545.526 million (detailed in the attachment). I also direct that \$545.526 million from sources detailed in the attachment be used to ensure adequate funding remains available for the current section 2808 military construction effort. This funding should be provided to the Secretary of the Army when it is needed for obligation.
