Plaintiff's opposition to this motion must be filed with the Court and served upon Defendants no later than 28 days from the date the motion is filed. 17 18 Defendants shall file a reply brief no later than 14 days after the date the opposition is filed. The 19 motion shall be deemed submitted as of the date the reply brief is due. No hearing will be held on 20 the motion. If the Court denies the motion for summary judgment for failure to exhaust administrative remedies, Defendants may file a second motion for summary judgment on the 21 22 merits. 23 This order terminates Dkt.
