On August 4, 2009, the County of Sacramento, California and the City of 24 Elk Grove, California (collectively "Proposed Intervenors") moved to intervene, to re-open and 25 vacate the judgment, and to dismiss the actions for lack of subject matter jurisdiction. reviewing the moving papers and considering oral argument from all of the parties, the Court is not inclined to dismiss the actions for lack of subject matter jurisdiction. To aid its consideration of the remaining motions, the Court requests supplemental briefing by the parties and Proposed Intervenors as to the relevance of the Supreme Court's recent decision in Carcieri v.
