Johnson v. Astrue

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After the Court issues an order for EAJA fees to Tina Johnson, the
government will consider the matter of Tina Johnson's assignment of EAJA fees to
Marc V. Kalagian. Pursuant to *Astrue v. Ratliff*, \_\_\_\_ U.S. \_\_\_\_, 2010 WL 2346547

[June 14, 2010], the ability to honor the assignment will depend on whether the
fees are subject to any offset allowed under the United States Department of the

Treasury's Offset Program. After the order for EAJA fees is entered, the

7 government will determine whether they are subject to any offset.

Fees shall be made payable to Tina Johnson, but if the Department of the Treasury determines that Tina Johnson does not owe a federal debt, then the government shall cause the payment of fees, expenses and costs to be made directly to Law Offices of Rohlfing & Kalagian, LLP, pursuant to the assignment executed by Tina Johnson. Any payments made shall be delivered to Marc V. Kalagian.

This stipulation constitutes a compromise settlement of Tina Johnson's request for EAJA attorney fees, and does not constitute an admission of liability on the part of Defendant under the EAJA. Payment of the agreed amount shall constitute a complete release from, and bar to, any and all claims that Tina Johnson and/or Marc V. Kalagian including Law Offices of Rohlfing & Kalagian, LLP may have relating to EAJA attorney fees in connection with this action.

Marc V. Kalagian reserves the right to contend that any non-payment caused by the collection of a federal debt owed by Tina Johnson violates 31 C.F.R. § 285.5(e)(5) and *Morrison v. C.I.R.*, 565 F.3d 658, 667 (9th Cir. 2009). Nothing in this stipulation shall be construed as an admission by Marc V. Kalagian that the Government has the right or authority to offset the fees due and payable pursuant to this stipulation.

1	This award is without prejudice to the rights of Marc V. Kalagian and/or
2	Rohlfing & Kalagian, LLP to seek Social Security Act attorney fees under 42
