2012 hearing. Short Decl. ¶ 2. Consequently, at the February 9 hearing, the Court struck Fusion Garage's answer. Dkt. No. 238 (minute order).

Because Fusion Garage has failed to appear and defend itself through counsel despite the Court's order, and because Fusion Garage's operative answer (Dkt. No. 207) has now been stricken, the plaintiffs respectfully ask that the Clerk enter default against Fusion Garage pursuant to Rule 55(a) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure.

Fusion Garage has received notice of this request for entry of default by service (via ECF/PACER and electronic mail) on its former counsel, pursuant to Northern District of California Civil Local Rule 11-5(b). See also Dkt. No. 236 ("Pursuant to Civil Local Rule 11-5(b), until new counsel has entered an appearance, any papers to be served on Fusion Garage may be served on Quinn Emmanuel for forwarding purposes."). As a courtesy, TechCrunch will also send (via Federal Express and fax) a copy of this request and the supporting declaration to Fusion Garage's liquidators in Singapore, who have previously responded to correspondence from TechCrunch's attorneys.
