**PLAINTIFF FACEBOOK INC.'S MOTION
 FOR ADMINISTRATIVE RELIEF FROM
 ORDER SETTING CASE MANAGEMENT
 CONFERENCE**

1 Pursuant to Local Rules 6-3, 7-1 and 7-11, Facebook, Inc. (“Facebook”) makes this
2 Motion for Administrative Relief to vacate the Case Management Conference (“CMC”) currently
3 scheduled for July 9, 2010 (“Motion”). Default has been entered against all Defendants and on
4 June 29, 2010, the Court granted Facebook’s request to obtain a copy of a hard drive from
5 Defendant’s Philip Poerembski’s abandoned computer recovered by the Sacramento Sheriff’s
6 Department. As a result, Facebook anticipates that it will be prepared to move for entry of default
7 judgment against all defendants on or before August 27, 2010. Facebook, therefore, respectfully
8 requests that the Court vacate the CMC and set August 27, 2010 as the deadline for Facebook to
9 file its Motion for Default Judgment. This Motion is based upon the below Memorandum of
10 Points and Authorities and Declaration of James R. McCullagh (“McCullagh Decl.”) filed
11 concurrently herewith.

12 **MEMORANDUM IN OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES**

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14 Facebook filed this lawsuit against Defendants for numerous misuses and abuses of
15 Facebook's website, network and the Facebook Platform, including large-scale phishing¹ and
16 spamming campaigns. Defendants are currently enjoined from conducting any activity on
17 Facebook. Electronic Docket Entry (“DE”) 29, 30, 33. After stipulating to injunctive relief,
18 Defendants stopped participating in this litigation and are in default.

19 Default was entered against each Defendant on April 26, 2010. DE 51. Facebook
20 thereafter learned that the Sacramento Sheriff’s Department had recovered a computer abandoned
21 by Defendant Porembski containing information relevant to this litigation. Declaration of James
22 R. McCullagh (“McCullagh Decl.”), ¶ 3. On June 4, 2010, Facebook requested permission to
23 conduct third party discovery. DE 53. On June 14, 2010, this Court entered an Order Granting

1 Plaintiff Facebook's Administrative Request for Leave to Conduct Discovery Prior to Rule 26
2 Conference. DE 56.

3 On or about June 22, 2010, Facebook issued a subpoena to the Sacramento Sheriff's
4 Department requesting a copy of the abandoned computer's hard drive as well as police reports
5 and witness statements related to the recovery of the abandoned computer. McCullagh Decl. ¶ 4.
6 The Sheriff's Department objected to producing the computer hard drive and requested that
7 Facebook obtain a Court order directing it to release this information to Facebook. McCullagh
8 Decl. ¶ 5.

9 On June 28, 2010, Facebook filed an Administrative Motion seeking a court order as
10 requested by the Sacramento Sheriff's Department. DE 57. The Court granted the request on
11 June 29, 2010. DE 61.

12 A CMC is currently scheduled for July 9, 2010 at 10:30 am. DE 55.

13 In light of Defendants' decision to not participate in this litigation, the previous entry of
14 Default as to all Defendants and the recent order permitting Facebook to obtain a copy of the hard
15 drive from Defendant Porembski's abandoned computer, the only issue left to address at a Case
16 Management Conference is the deadline for Facebook to file its Motion for Default Judgment.

17 Facebook requests that it be allowed a reasonable amount of time to obtain and inspect a
18 copy of Defendant Porembski's computer hard drive, conduct any necessary follow-up discovery,
19 and prepare its Motion for Default Judgment. Facebook believes that it can complete these
20 activities within 60 days and therefore requests that the Court set August 27, 2010 as the deadline
21 for filing its Motion for Default Judgment.

22 23 CONCLUSION

24 For the reasons set forth above, Facebook respectfully requests that the Court vacate the
25 CMC currently set for July 9, 2010 and set August 27, 2010 as the deadline for filing its Motion
26 for Default Judgment.
