The same day, the court notified plaintiff that he had not paid the filing fee nor had he filed an application to proceed in forma pauperis ("IFP"). The 19 20 court also notified plaintiff that he failed to submit a complaint. Along with the deficiency 21 notices, plaintiff was provided with a new IFP application, instructions for completing it, notified 22 that he had to specifically include a Certificate of Funds completed and signed by an authorized 23 officer at the prison, and a stamped return envelope. Plaintiff was cautioned that his failure to 24 either file a completed IFP application or pay the filing fee within thirty days would result in the 25 dismissal of this action. Plaintiff was further cautioned that his failure to file a complaint within 26 thirty days would result in the dismissal of this action. To date, plaintiff has not communicated 27 with the court. 28 Accordingly, the instant action is DISMISSED without prejudice to plaintiff filing a new Order of Dismissal P:\PRO-SE\SJ.Rmw\CR.10\Fuller547dis.wpd
