

1 the Treasury's Offset Program. After the order for EAJA fees and expenses is entered, the Government will
2 determine whether they are subject to any offset. Fees and expenses shall be made payable to Plaintiff, but
3 if the Department of the Treasury determines that Plaintiff does not owe a federal debt, then the Government
4 shall cause the payment of fees, expenses and costs to be made directly to Harvey P. Sackett, pursuant to
5 the assignment executed by Plaintiff. Any payments made shall be delivered to Plaintiff's counsel.

6 This stipulation constitutes a compromise settlement of Plaintiff's request for EAJA attorney fees
7 and expenses, and does not constitute an admission of liability on the part of Defendant under the EAJA.
8 Payment of the agreed amount shall constitute a complete release from, and bar to, any and all claims that
9 Plaintiff and/or Plaintiff's counsel may have relating to EAJA attorney fees and expenses in connection with
10 this action.

11 This award is without prejudice to the rights of Plaintiff's counsel to seek Social Security Act
12 attorney fees under 42 U.S.C. § 406, subject to the offset provisions of the EAJA.
