- 3. As reflected in my firm's resume (a copy is attached hereto as Exhibit A), I graduated first in my class from the William H. Bowen School of Law at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock in 2000.
- 4. After graduation, I served as an elbow law clerk to the Honorable S. Arthur Spiegel, United States District Judge, Southern District of Ohio from 2000 to 2002. While in that position, I assisted the Court in overseeing numerous class action lawsuits and other complex litigation matters.
