The parties were 18 required to file a case management statement by March 29, 2011. The parties were also required 19 either to consent to proceed before a magistrate judge or to request reassignment to a district 20 judge.<sup>2</sup> No case management statement was filed and none of the parties have either consented or 21 declined to proceed before a magistrate judge. A review of the docket does not indicate that any 22 defendant has been served yet. 23 Pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 4(m), if a defendant is not served within 120 days after the 24 complaint is filed, the court must dismiss the action unless the plaintiff shows good cause for the 25 failure. Plaintiff filed the Complaint on January 5, 2011. May 5, 2011. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that no later than April 5, 2011, Plaintiff and any Defendants who have appeared shall file either a "Consent to Proceed Before a United States Magistrate Judge," or else a "Declination to Proceed Before a United States Magistrate Judge and Request for Reassignment." Both forms are available from the clerk of the court, or from the Forms (Civil) section of the court's website at www.cand.uscourts.gov. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the case management conference is continued to May 17, 2011 at 2 p.m. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that no later than May 10, 2011, the parties shall file a joint case management statement. If Defendants have not been served, Plaintiff must file a case management statement showing any good cause that exists for the failure to serve. Dated: March 30, 2011 United States Magistrate Judge
