- Mediation (ADR L.R. 6)

They must instead file a Notice of Need for ADR Phone Conference. See Civil Local Rule 16-8 and ADR L.R. 3-5)*

Private ADR (please identify process and provider) to be determined at a date after the parties exchange Initial Disclosures and complete preliminary discovery (including Plaintiff's deposition).

The parties agree to hold the ADR session by:


- the presumptive deadline (*The deadline is 90 days from the date of the order referring the case to an ADR process unless otherwise ordered.*)
