The Court may, without prejudice, dismiss a complaint when: (1) mail directed to the <u>prose</u> se party by the Court has been returned to the Court as not deliverable, and (2) the Court fails to receive within sixty days of this return a written communication from the <u>prose</u> party indicating a current address. <u>See</u> L.R. 3-11(b).

More than sixty days have passed since the mail addressed to Plaintiff was returned as undeliverable. The Court has not received a notice from Plaintiff of a new address. Accordingly, the instant civil rights action is DISMISSED without prejudice pursuant to Rule 3-11 of the Northern District Local Rules.

The Clerk shall terminate any pending motions.
