agreement regarding ADR, early discovery efforts, timing of initial disclosures, and to come up with a discovery plan, so that they [may] submit a more informed CMC statement to [the] Court." *Id.*

While the Court recognizes that the Case Management Conference was scheduled on short notice, a 60 to 90 day extension would unnecessarily postpone the initial Case Management Conference. This case was filed in March 2012. Defendants filed their answers in mid-August and early September 2012. Moreover, as to the parties' statement that they are working to reach agreement on the timing of initial disclosures, Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 26 governs the timing of initial disclosures, and the Court disfavors deviation from the Federal Rules.

Nonetheless, based on the shortness of the notice of the Case Management Conference, the Court believes some extension is appropriate. Accordingly, the Case Management Conference is hereby CONTINUED from October 31, 2012 to November 20, 2012 at 1:30 p.m. The parties' Case Management Conference Statement is due November 13, 2012.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
