that plaintiff's renewed motion for leave to conduct jurisdictional discovery could be set for hearing before Judge Koh on May 8, 2014. (Dkt. No. 39). Whether or not jurisdictional discovery should be allowed is a threshold question for the presiding judge to determine in the first instance.

There is no indication that Judge Koh has determined that jurisdictional discovery is necessary or
appropriate to resolve defendants' pending motion, and she has not referred that particular
question to the undersigned. Accordingly, the DDJR is denied, subject to whatever decision Judge
Koh may make on that issue. 1
