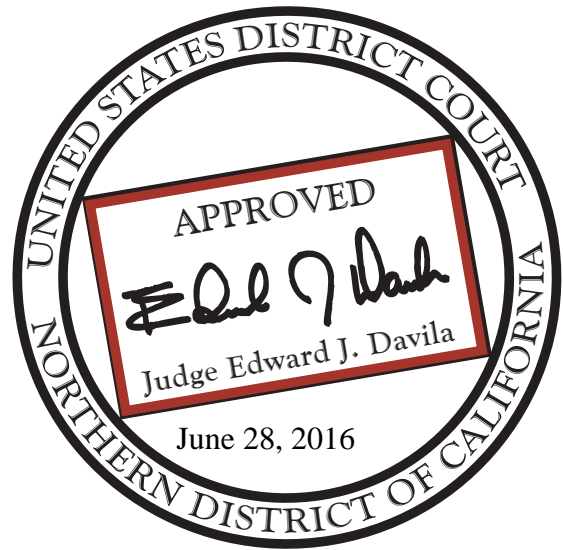

22 Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 41(a)(1) provides, in relevant part:

23 41(a) Voluntary Dismissal

24 (1) By the Plaintiff

25 (a) Without a Court Order. Subject to Rules 23(3), 23.1(c), 23.2, and 66 and any
 26 applicable federal statute, the plaintiff may dismiss an action without a court
 27 order by filing:
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(1) a notice of dismissal before the opposing party serves either an answer
or a motion for summary judgment.

Defendant Ad Astra Recovery Services, Inc. has neither answered Plaintiff's Complaint,
nor filed a motion for summary judgment. Accordingly, the matter may be dismissed, with
prejudice, against it for all purposes and without an Order of the Court.
