

the party is granted leave to proceed *in forma pauperis* ("IFP") pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915(a).
 See Rodriguez v. Cook, 169 F.3d 1176, 1177 (9th Cir. 1999).

Here, Plaintiff has neither prepaid the \$350 filing fee required to commence this action,
nor has he submitted a Motion to Proceed IFP. Therefore, this action is subject to immediate
dismissal pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1914(a).

II.

Conclusion and Order

For the reasons set forth above, the Court hereby:

8 (1) **DISMISSES** this action sua sponte without prejudice for failing to pay the \$350 9 filing fee or file a Motion to Proceed IFP pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1914(a) and 1915(a); and

.

(2) GRANTS Plaintiff forty five (45) days leave from the date this Order is "Filed"
to: (a) prepay the entire \$350 civil filing fee in full; *or* (b) complete and file a Motion to proceed
IFP which includes a certified copy of his trust account statement for the 6-month period
preceding the filing of his Complaint pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915(a)(2) and S.D. CAL. CIVLR
3.2(b).

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of the Court shall provide Plaintiff with the
Court's approved form "Motion and Declaration in Support of Motion to Proceed *In Forma Pauperis.*" If Plaintiff fails to either prepay the \$350 civil filing fee or complete and submit the
attached Motion to Proceed IFP within that time, this action shall remain dismissed without
prejudice and without further Order of the Court.
