8	4. To coordinate, establish or maintain a document repository, real or virtual, to
9	be available to all participating plaintiffs' counsel;
10	5. To maintain complete files with copies of all documents served by or upon her
11	in hard copy or electronic form. Liaison counsel shall make such files
12	available at reasonable hours to Plaintiffs' counsel of record upon request.
13	6. To receive orders and notices from the Judicial Panel on Multidistrict
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15	Litigation pursuant to Rule 5.2(e) of the Panel's Rules of Procedure or from
16	the Court on behalf of all personal injury Plaintiffs;
17	7. To carry out such other duties as the Court may order.

12	B. The Court hereby charges the PSC with the following responsibilities:
13	1. General. The PSC shall:
14	a. Determine and present to the Court and opposing parties the position of
15	the personal injury Plaintiffs on all coordinated matters arising during
16 17	pretrial proceedings;
17	b. Coordinate the initiation and conduct of discovery for the common benefit
19	of the personal injury Plaintiffs;
20	c. Submit, where needed, additional committees and counsel for designation
21	by the Court; and
22	d. Perform other such duties as may be incidental to the proper coordination
23	of Plaintiffs' pretrial activities.
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1	2.	Di	scovery. The PSC shall:
2		a.	Initiate, coordinate, and conduct all pretrial discovery on behalf of personal
3			injury plaintiffs in all actions which are consolidated with the instant
4			Multidistrict Ligation;
5		b.	Develop and propose to the Court schedules for the commencement,
6			execution, and completion of all discovery on behalf of all personal injury
7			plaintiffs;
8		_	
9 10		C.	Cause to be issued in the name of all personal injury plaintiffs the
10			necessary discovery requests, motions, and subpoenas pertaining to any
11			witnesses and documents needed to properly prepare for the trial of
13			relevant issues. Similar requests, notices, and subpoenas may be caused
14			to be issued by the PSC upon written request by an individual attorney in
15			order to assist him/her in the preparation of the pretrial stages of his/her
16			client's particular claims;
17		d.	Conduct all discovery in a coordinated and consolidated manner on behalf
18			of and for the benefit of all plaintiffs, in a fashion in keeping with practice
19			guidelines to be established in subsequent discovery plans or orders of
20			this Court.
21	3.	He	earings and Meetings. The PSC shall:
22			Call meetings of plaintiffs' counsel for any appropriate purpose, including
23		a.	
24 25			coordinating responses to questions of other parties or of the Court;
25 26		b.	Initiate proposals, suggestions, schedules, or joint briefs, and any other
20			appropriate matter(s) pertaining to pretrial proceedings;
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1	c. Examine witnesses and introduce evidence at hearings on behalf of	
2	plaintiffs;	
3	d. Act as spokesperson for all personal injury plaintiffs at pretrial proceedings	
4	and in response to any inquiries by the Court, subject to the right of any	
5	plaintiff's counsel to present non-repetitive, individual or different positions.	
6	4. Miscellaneous. In addition, the PSC shall:	
7	a. Submit and argue any verbal or written motions presented to the Court or	
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9	Magistrate Judge on behalf of the PSC as well as oppose, when	
10	necessary, any motions submitted by the defendants or other parties that	
11	involve matters within the sphere of the responsibilities of the PSC;	
12	b. Negotiate and enter into stipulations with defendants regarding this	
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14	litigation. All such stipulations entered into by the PSC, except for purely	
15	administrative details such as scheduling, shall be submitted to the Court	
16	for approval and will not be binding unless and until the Court has ratified	
17	the stipulation. Any attorney not in agreement with a non-administrative	
18	stipulation may file with the Court a written objection thereto within ten (10)	
19	business days after he or she knows or reasonably should have become	
20	aware of the stipulation. Failure timely to object shall be deemed a waiver,	
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22	and the stipulation shall bind the dilatory party;	
23	c. Explore, develop and pursue all settlement options pertaining to any claim	
24	or portion thereof of any case filed in this litigation;	
25	d. Maintain adequate files of all pretrial matters and have them available,	
26	under reasonable terms and conditions, for examination by plaintiffs or	
27	their attorneys;	
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1	e. Prepare periodic status reports summarizing the PSC's work and					
2	progress. These reports shall be submitted to the Plaintiffs' Liaison					
3	Counsel, who will promptly distribute copies to the other plaintiffs'					
4	attorneys;					
5	f. Perform any task necessary and proper for the PSC to accomplish its					
6 7	responsibilities as defined or authorized by the Court's orders;					
8	g. Perform such other functions as may be expressly authorized by further					
9	orders of this Court;					
10	5. Reimbursement.					
11	Plaintiffs' Liaison Counsel, Executive Committee and PSC members shall be					
12	entitled to seek reimbursement for fees and costs expended in the performance of their					
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14	duties at the time and in a manner approved by the Court.
