**ORDER GRANTING RULE 56(f)  
CONTINUANCE**

16 Plaintiff's Ex Parte Application for Continuance of Defendants' Motion for Summary Judgment  
17 is before the Court. (Dkt. No. 49.) Plaintiff requested the continuance pursuant to Federal Rule of  
18 Civil Procedure 56(f) to conduct necessary discovery regarding Defendants Lineberry's and Stinnett's  
19 personnel files. As of the date Plaintiff filed the present motion, Plaintiff had been unable to obtain  
20 Defendants' personnel files, however, a protective order was filed on November 23, 2010 addressing  
21 the disputed discovery. Defendants oppose Plaintiffs' request for a continuance. (Dkt. No. 53.)


22 Under Rule 56(f), the Court must deny or continue a motion for summary judgment if an  
23 opposing party can show that "for specified reasons, it cannot present facts essential to justify its  
24 opposition." *See also Metabolife Int'l, Inc. v. Wornick*, 264 F.3d 832, 846 (9th Cir. 2001) (the Rule  
25 "requir[es], rather than merely permit[s], discovery where the nonmoving party has not had the  
26 opportunity to discover information that is essential to its opposition."). The opposing party "must  
27 identify the specific facts that further discovery would reveal and explain why those facts would  
28 preclude summary judgment." *Tatum v. San Francisco*, 441 F.3d 1090, 1100 (9th Cir. 2006).

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Plaintiff has identified specific information that satisfies his Rule 56(f) burden, justifying a brief continuance. Accordingly, the pending motion for summary judgment is continued to **January 24, 2011 at 10:30 a.m.** Briefing shall comply with Civil Local Rule 7.1(e).
