Mr. Quinn further states that he "intend[s] to file a dispositive motion on behalf of Defendants, but need[s] additional time to, among other things, review [Plaintiff Mr.] Riley's file and related documents, and consult with Defendants and prison staff that are familiar with Riley's claims in order to obtain declarations and documents from them." Id. ¶ 4. Finally, Mr. Quinn states that he "ha[s] not attempted to contact [Plaintiff Mr.] Riley for a stipulated request to extend time because he is a pro-se [sic] prisoner who is not easily available by telephone." Id. ¶ 5.

After considering the Ex Parte Application, the Court finds good cause to grant an extension of time to file pretrial motions but for a shorter amount of time than requested. Accordingly, Defendants' Ex Parte Application is **GRANTED IN PART AND DENIED IN PART.** Defendants' deadline to file dispositive pretrial motions, including motions for summary judgment and motions addressing <u>Daubert</u> issues, is hereby extended to <u>August 20, 2021</u>. Prior to filing a pretrial motion, counsel for the moving party must obtain a motion hearing date from Judge Anello's law clerk. The period of time between the date counsel requests a motion date and the hearing date may vary from one district judge to another. Please plan accordingly. Failure to make a timely request for a motion date may result in the motion not being heard.

All other requirements and deadlines shall remain as set. ECF No. 68.
