**ORDER DENYING PLAINTIFF'S  
APPLICATION TO PROCEED IN  
FORMA PAUPERIS**

[Dkt. No. 2.]

21 On September 12, 2017, Plaintiff Constantine Gus Cristo, proceeding *pro se*,  
22 filed a complaint along with an application to proceed in fauma pauperis. (Dkt. Nos.  
23 1, 2.)

24 All parties instituting any civil action, suit, or proceeding in a district court of  
25 the United States, except an application for writ of habeas corpus, must pay a filing fee  
26 of \$400. See 28 U.S.C. § 1914(a).<sup>1</sup> An action may proceed despite a plaintiff's failure  
27 to prepay the entire fee only if he is granted leave to proceed IFP pursuant to § 1915(a).


28 <sup>1</sup> In addition to the \$350 statutory fee, civil litigants must pay an additional administrative fee  
of \$50. See 28 U.S.C. § 1914(a) (Judicial Conference Schedule of Fees, District Court Misc. Fee  
Schedule, § 14 (eff. Dec. 1, 2014)). The additional \$50 administrative fee does not apply to persons  
granted leave to proceed IFP. Id.

1 See Andrews v. Cervantes, 493 F.3d 1047, 1051 (9th Cir. 2007); Rodriguez v. Cook,  
2 169 F.3d 1176, 1177 (9th Cir. 1999). The plaintiff must submit an affidavit  
3 demonstrating his inability to pay the filing fee, and the affidavit must include a  
4 complete statement of the plaintiff's assets. 28 U.S.C. § 1915(a)(1).

5 Here, Plaintiff submitted a declaration reporting that he currently employed but  
6 does not indicate his gross monthly pay. (Dkt. No. 2 at 2.) He also reports retirement  
7 income of \$853.90 and has \$500 in his Charles Schwab account. (Id.) Plaintiff further  
8 claims he has no real property, vehicles or other assets. (Id. at 2-3.) Since it appears  
9 that Plaintiff is currently employed and does not provide his monthly income, the Court  
10 is unable to determine whether Plaintiff meets the § 1915(a) requirements to proceed  
11 IFP. Therefore, the Court DENIES Plaintiff's motion for leave to proceed IFP.

12 IT IS SO ORDERED.
