On March 1, 2023, the parties filed a Joint Motion to Continue Discovery Motion Deadline. 18 19 ECF Nos. 37. The parties seek to extend the deadline to file a discovery motion related to Defendants' discovery responses an additional three weeks from March 2, 2023 to March 23, 20 2023. ECF No. Id. at 3. In support, the parties indicate that they "have engaged in extensive 21 discussions over the course of several weeks in an effort to resolve [the discovery] disputes 22 informally." Id. at 1. In further support, the parties state that they have resolved a majority of 23 the disputes through their meet and confer efforts, but potential disputes remain for which 24 "Defendants' counsel[] requests additional time to determine the scope and technical feasibility 25 of the requests as narrowed and clarified through the meet-and-confer process." Id. at 2. The 26 parties further represent that the requested continuance would allow time for the parties to 27 resolve the remaining disputes without the Court's intervention, "significantly conserv[ing] 28

judicial resources and sav[ing] needless effort and expense." <u>Id.</u> This is the parties' first request
to extend the deadline to file a discovery motion related to Defendants' responses. <u>See</u> Docket.
Good cause appearing, the Court **GRANTS** the parties' motion and continues the deadline
to file a discovery motion to <u>March 23, 2023</u>.
