**ORDER OF DISMISSAL**

The following matters are before me for consideration: (1) the **Joint Stipulation For Dismissal With Prejudice** [#128]<sup>1</sup> filed May 27, 2011; and (2) the **Joint Stipulation For Dismissal With Prejudice** [#129] filed May 27, 2011. After reviewing the stipulations and the file, I conclude that the stipulations should be approved and that this action should be dismissed with prejudice.

**THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED** as follows:

1. That the **Joint Stipulation For Dismissal With Prejudice** [#128] filed May 27, 2011, as to the defendants in their individual capacities, is **APPROVED**;
2. That the **Joint Stipulation For Dismissal With Prejudice** [#129] filed May 27, 2011, as to the defendants in their official capacities, is **APPROVED**;



3. That the Trial Preparation Conference set for November 4, 2011, is **VACATED**;
4. That the jury trial set to commence November 28, 2011, is **VACATED**;
5. That any pending motion is **DENIED** as moot; and
6. That this action is **DISMISSED WITH PREJUDICE** with the parties to pay their own attorney fees and costs.
