The matter before the court is the **Unopposed Motion To Withdraw Plaintiff's Motion For Preliminary Injunction and To Administratively Close Action Without Prejudice** [#52] filed May 12, 2010. 
2. That plaintiff's **Motion For Preliminary Injunction** [#12] filed September 1,
