MINUTE ORDER

ENTERED BY MAGISTRATE JUDGE KRISTEN L. MIX

This matter is before the Court on Plaintiff's **Motion to Deny and/or Dismiss Defendant's Response to Plaintiff's Motion in Response for a More Definite Statement Pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 12(e) and to Dismiss Pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 12(b)(1) and 12(b)(6)** [Docket No. 67; Filed June 20, 2012] (the "Motion"). As an initial matter, the Motion does not comply with D.C.COLO.LCivR 7.1A, which provides as follows:

The Court will not consider any motion, other than a motion under Fed. R. Civ. P. 12 or 56, unless counsel for the moving party or a *pro se* party, before filing the motion, has conferred or made reasonable, good faith efforts to confer with opposing counsel or a *pro se* party to resolve the disputed matter. The moving party shall state in the motion, or in a certificate attached to the motion, the specific efforts to comply with this rule.

The Motion is subject to denial on this basis alone. Accordingly,

IT IS HEREBY **ORDERED** that the Motion [#67] is **DENIED WITHOUT PREJUDICE**.
