The matter is before the court on **Defendant Dollar Tree Stores, Inc.'s Motion To Increase The Page Limit For its Briefs in Opposition To Plaintiff's Certification Motions** [#90]² filed December 16, 2011. The motion is **GRANTED** in part. The defendant's response to the plaintiff's motion for class certification may exceed the page limitation by 14 pages. The defendant's response to the plaintiff's motion for conditional certification and to permit supervised notice of potential opt in plaintiffs may exceed the page limitation by 8 pages. Otherwise, the defendant's motion is denied.
