## ORDER OF DISMISSAL

## Blackburn, J.

The matter is before me on the **Stipulation For Dismissal** *Without Prejudice* **Between Plaintiff and Defendant Volunteers of America, Pursuant To F.R.C.P. 41(a)(1)(a)(ii)** [#59]<sup>1</sup> filed April 3, 2013.
