The matter is before me on the **Notice of Voluntary Dismissal of Defendant JWL Management, LLC** [#17]<sup>1</sup> filed April 4, 2012. After reviewing the notice and the file, I conclude that the notice should be approved and that plaintiff's claims against defendant, JWL Management, LLC, should be dismissed without prejudice.

**THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED** as follows:

1. That the **Notice of Voluntary Dismissal of Defendant JWL Management, LLC** [#17] filed April 4, 2012, is **APPROVED**;
2. That plaintiff's claims against defendant, JWL Management, LLC, are
