**ORDER OF DISMISSAL**

The matter is before me on the **Stipulation To Dismiss With Prejudice** [#30]<sup>1</sup> filed January 9, 2014. After reviewing the stipulation and the record, I conclude that the stipulation should be approved and that this action should be dismissed with prejudice.
